

ByDS is a mexican/german "alternative dance" project based in Berlin.

formed by Brigitte Richter and Diego Aguirre. Together for over 20 years as partners and musicians, they blend electronic beats, analog synths, guitars, and multilingual vocals (English, German, Spanish) into a sound that is as entertaining as it is thought-provoking. Their style fuses alternative rock pop with dark electronic, Latin rhythms (Cumbia, Danzón), trip-hop, drum & bass, and techno.

ByDS was born in 2015 at Germany's Fusion Festival, after the couple's final show with their former Mexican band Tanke. With Tanke, they released four albums, toured internationally, and collaborated with renowned Mexican artists such as members of Molotov, Panteón Rococó, and Fobia, as well as Oscar-nominated actress Marina de Tavira. The move to Berlin opened a new chapter, and ByDS has since released an EP (Flow, 2018) and several singles, leading to their new album Our Long Weekend in June 2025.

The Album is ByDS's most personal work to date. It explores love in its many dimensions: fear, regret, passion, faith, reinvention, spiritual connection, and joy.

Inspired by their early days as a young couple calling their shared life a "long weekend," the record is an ode to lightness, creativity, and resilience.

Produced entirely by the duo, the album combines handmade electronic beats and bass with analog synths and guitars, keeping the voices at the forefront. The result: songs with emotional depth that are still easy to listen to and dance to.

The album has been received well in the Press all over Europe and Mexico with a feature in Fame Magazine UK, Muzikalia (Spain), reviews, electronic playlists, radioprogramming and Increasing streams and followers across digital platforms.

The band was invited to play at festivals in Germany and Mexico, and has this Summer played Live shows including Karneval der Kulturen, Sky Sounds Tempelhofer Flughafen, Intercultural Festival, Schokoladen Berlin and as a highlight was opening act for Molotov in the uber eats Music Hall Berlin in 2025. In 2026 a Mexico tour is planned.
